

## Aims & Scope

Established in 1986 by the International Sociological Association (ISA), *International Sociology* is a highly ranked peer reviewed Journal whose aim is to reflect the theoretical and empirical diversity of international sociology. Particularly welcome are papers which explore contemporary social challenges and transformations affecting global society or which highlight how an international perspective can provide fresh insights contributing to the development of international sociological theory and knowledge. As the Journal caters for the diverse sociological community it welcomes theoretical contributions as well as more empirical papers using qualitative and quantitative approaches.

## Guidelines for Contributors

*International Sociology* has a fully web-based system for the submission and review of manuscripts. All submissions should be made online at the *International Sociology* SAGETRACK Website <http://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/is>

1. Contributions may be submitted in English, French and Spanish, but will be published only in English.
2. *International Sociology* adheres to a rigorous double-blind reviewing policy in which the identity of both the reviewer and author are always concealed from both parties. All manuscripts are reviewed initially by the Editor and only those papers that meet the scientific and editorial standards of the Journal, and fit within the aims and scope of the Journal, will be sent for outside review.
3. Contributions are considered for publication only on the understanding that they are not simultaneously under consideration elsewhere in English, that they are the original work of the author(s), and that any previous form of publication and any current consideration in other languages are disclosed. Authors assign copyright to the International Sociological Association.
4. The standard length of papers is around 8000 words, but shorter contributions are also welcomed. They should be typed, double spaced with margins of 3 cm.
5. *International Sociology* strongly prefers electronic submissions online. If you are unable to submit an electronic version, see the mailing address below.
6. Title, author's name, full address and brief biographical note will be required, with an abstract of 150 words and about 5 key words.
7. Tables should be numbered and cited in numerical order in the text. Appendix tables are numbered as A1, A2, etc. Titles of tables should identify the table clearly and briefly as possible and be unique from other table titles. Any explanatory material (e.g., sample size) should be placed in a 'note' at the bottom of the table or within the table itself. When creating tables, do not use tabs and spaces or break contents of a cell across multiple cells. Column headings should identify the column as briefly as possible. Footnotes to Tables should only contain useful information about the table such as definitions of abbreviations used. If relevant, tables may also have a separate note labeled as 'source(s)' to list the source(s) used in constructing the table. Notes indicating the standard levels of significance in statistical tables should use asterisks.
8. Figures, maps and diagrams should be precisely and boldly drawn to permit photographic reproduction. Use single quotation marks (except for quotes within quotes). In case of quotations, referencing in the text should be as follows: (Smith, 1995: 234).
9. Notes should appear at the end of the text directly after the text and before the references.
10. Referencing are presented in a separate References section. For details on referencing please see our website: <http://iss.sagepub.com/>
11. Authors are responsible for obtaining copyright permission for reproducing any illustrations, tables, figures or lengthy quotations published elsewhere. Upon publication, authors receive proofs of their articles, a pdf of the published version and one copy of the Journal.
