Dear friends and colleagues,

as you probably know, since September 2017, Mexico has been repeatedly hit by seismic events that have severely damaged its monumental historical heritage. The seismic shocks are not finished yet. More than two thousand classified monumental buildings were, in various ways, affected: cathedrals, monasteries and convents, small chapels, palaces and civil buildings, houses.

Several of these buildings are inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List.

The affected areas, in addition to Mexico City, are mainly located in the States of the South and the East of Mexico City (Puebla, Morelos, Guerrero, Oaxaca, Chiapas).

The Secretariat of Culture (Ministry of Culture) has launched a call addressed to professionals, specialists and institutions, national and international, willing to collaborate voluntarily and at their own expense in the tasks of reconstruction of this extraordinary cultural heritage.

This collaboration can be developed by carrying out studies, analysis, surveys, risk assessments, structural recommendations, projects and restoration works.

I attach the text of the call.
