ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF SOCIOLOGY Arizona State University Starting Fall, 2019 ASU Job #12556

The T. Denny Sanford School of Social and Family Dynamics (SSFD) at Arizona State University (<https://thesanfordschool.asu.edu>) invites applications for a full time tenure-track Assistant Professor of Sociology beginning Fall 2019. We seek a community-engaged scholar with a Latinx focus. Areas of expertise are open but preferred areas of specialization include immigration, education, social movements, labor, environment/sustainability, and health. We are especially interested in scholars who take an intersectional approach or whose research reflects the diversity within the Latinx population (such as gender, sexuality, race, ethnicity, national origins, indigeneity, or legal status). This position is part of an effort to build a 21st-century sociology program with new and existing resources in the well-established and successful School of Social and Family Dynamics.

For this position, candidates must have a PhD in sociology by time of appointment and show evidence of, or potential for, excellence in research, teaching, and service. The ideal candidate must also demonstrate sustained and significant engagement in Latinx communities. The candidate will be expected to teach sociology courses including a course on community-based research, mentor undergraduate and graduate students, develop a vigorous research program, maintain an active agenda of peer-reviewed publications, participate in service to the university and profession, and contribute to the growth of the sociology program. Preference will be given to candidates who use qualitative methods, have experience in interdisciplinary settings and have demonstrated success in meeting the needs of diverse student populations and/or diverse communities.

SSFD is an innovative interdisciplinary academic unit focused on the health and well-being of individuals, families, groups, organizations, and society. SSFD has launched a multi-pronged program of scholarship, translation, and impact focused on Diversity and Inclusion Science (<https://thesanfordschool.asu.edu/disi>). With 50+ full-time faculty, 500+ graduate students, and 3,000+ undergraduate majors/minors, SSFD has a doctoral and online master's degree in sociology as well as doctoral and online master's degrees in family and human development. SSFD takes pride in having a collegial atmosphere bolstered by permeable boundaries among its faculty and its ties to many other units. The School's program in sociology is targeted for growth. ASU's location within the Phoenix metropolitan region (the nation's 5th most populous city) with a large Latinx population provides a rich context for basic and applied research and community engagement in many areas related to sociology.

Arizona State University invites applications for the position of Director of the School of Transborder Studies (STS) with a concurrent appointment as tenured Professor. Appointment will be located on the Tempe campus with an anticipated start date of July 1, 2019. Salary and start-up will be competitive and commensurate with qualifications.

Reporting to the Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences through the Dean of Social Sciences, the Director will lead STS in shaping, consolidating, and expanding its different research, instructional, service, and community endeavors. As an intellectual leader, the director must be strongly committed to supporting the multidisciplinary, scholarly work that is central to the mission of STS; advancing the school's standing as a center of knowledge production on transborder studies both nationally and internationally; and faculty governance. They will also provide strong leadership in fiscal planning and administration, development and donor relations, research advancement programs and funding, recruitment and retention, planning and implementation of degree programs, and in the exploration and development of opportunities for collaboration within and beyond the university as well as the development/implementation of strategic diversity initiatives related to faculty, staff and/or students.

STS is the home to a dynamic and interdisciplinary faculty focused on the theoretical and empirical examination of transborder processes and communities. STS approaches transborder studies in a way that is both grounded in and inspired by the geographical specificity of the U.S.-Mexico border as well as the broad theoretical applications of border studies. This approach is unique among U.S. universities and an emerging field of study globally. The location of STS in the Phoenix metropolitan area, a center of Mexican origin and other Latinx populations and epicenter of rapid changes in the social and demographic landscape of the United States, makes this unit an ideal place to study these issues.

STS offers an undergraduate degree in Transborder Chicana/o and Latina/o Studies with three interdisciplinary concentrations: media and expressive culture, transborder community development and health, and U.S. and Mexican regional immigration policy and economy. A PhD in Transborder Studies allows a broad selection of topics in that area. STS maintains a strong program of collaboration with Latinx communities in Arizona and also sustains a strong research and exchange program with Mexican academic institutions on the border and beyond.

Required qualifications include: • Ph.D. (or equivalent) in a social science, humanities, or transdisciplinary discipline relevant to transborder studies • Extensive scholarship and demonstrated leadership in his or her field with a focus on Mexican origin and other Latinx and transborder studies • A record of excellence in teaching, service, and administrative experience in an academic setting • A scholarly record commensurate with the rank of tenured Professor in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences

Desired qualifications include: • A record of externally funded research • Experience with program development in curriculum and graduate education • Involvement with community-based research initiatives • Spanish language proficiency • Demonstrated success meeting the needs of diverse student populations and/or reaching out to diverse communities

SST faculty represent humanities, social sciences, and interdisciplinary fields (including creative arts), and they are distinguished nationally and internationally for their scholarship. The faculty seek to think and to train students to think in more complex ways about race, ethnicity, gender, class, sexuality, social and economic justice, immigration status, and labor; to be accountable to the communities with which they engage; and to foreground social transformation on local, national, and global levels.
