FROM LIBERDADE TO LITTLE TOKYO

Resisting Racism and Erasure, Building Cross-Racial Solidarity

Long a home to Afro and Japanese-Brazilian communities, the Liberdade neighborhood in São Paulo/Brazil has survived forces of displacement, exclusion, and segregation. What can we learn about resistance to erasure and removal from this pan-ethnic history? What is the role of art and museums in constructing a collective memory of place and justifying a "right to the city"?

This event will inaugurate the opening of the exhibit, "Liberdade: place of diasporas, ancestries and coexistence", which launches in December at the Japanese Overseas Migration Museum at the Japanese International Cooperation Agency (JICA) in Yokohama, Japan. The exhibit team will showcase findings from their archival and interview-based research and present the online/remote components of the exhibit. We will put Liberdade in dialogue with other ethnic neighborhoods in the Japanese diaspora, hearing from discussants who will share their experiences with uplifting marginalized histories, place-based organizing, resistance to gentrification, and building solidarity across classes and race/ethnicity in Little Tokyo, Los Angeles; and San Jose Japantown.

Participatory exhibition at JICA Yokohama will have a set of photographs, oral history video, counter-cartographies, interactive elements and online tour (free access).
