For junior faculty currently in their third year of a tenure-track position:

<u>The Career Enhancement Fellowship for Junior Faculty</u>: This pre-tenure award seeks to increase the presence of minority junior faculty members and other faculty members committed to eradicating racial disparities in core fields in the arts and humanities. This Fellowship includes a sabbatical grant, a research/travel/publication stipend, and participation in an annual retreat. A total of 30 Fellowships are awarded each year. In just 15 years, over 200 outstanding Fellows have attained tenure and made significant contributions to the academy and their communities. **The application deadline is October 26, 2018.**

Exclusively for adjunct faculty who are MMUF Fellows:

<u>The Career Enhancement Adjunct Faculty Fellowship</u>: We are proud to offer this award, now in its third year, which seeks to increase the presence of MMUF Fellows among tenure-track faculty. The Fellowship provides each Fellow with a six-month period to focus on the research and scholarship necessary to secure a tenure-track position, along with the guidance of an assigned mentor and informal network of Mellon faculty. Two Fellowships are awarded each year. **The application deadline is November 9, 2018.**

For MMUF Fellows ready to begin writing the dissertation:

<u>MMUF Dissertation Grants</u> provide up to \$25,000 in support to Fellows who have completed their research and are ready to begin writing the dissertation. Each year, a minimum of five Fellows are awarded MMUF Dissertation Grants. The twelve-month grant period begins in June 2019. This award recognizes the outstanding accomplishments of MMUF Fellows throughout the graduate school journey and assists highly qualified students to complete their dissertations in a timely manner. **The deadline for 2019 Dissertation Grants is November 30, 2018.**

For assistant professors in the fourth or fifth year of the tenure-track appointment:

The <u>Nancy Weiss Malkiel Scholars Award Program</u> is for **tenure-track** faculty who are committed not only to research and teaching but also to building a more inclusive scholarly community. Applicants may not be going up for tenure during the award year (2018–19).

Supported by the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation and administered by the Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation, the Malkiel Scholars Award offers a \$17,500 stipend—\$10,000 to be used for summer research support and \$7,500 for research assistance during the academic year. While Malkiel Scholars may be working in any field of the humanities or social sciences, preference will be given to those whose work relates to 20th- and 21st-century American history, politics, culture, and society, with emphases including but not limited to African American issues, women's issues, and/or higher education. **The application deadline is December 3, 2018 at 5 p.m. ET.**
