Seismic Retrofitting Project

The <u>Seismic Retrofitting Project</u> seeks to combine traditional construction techniques and materials with high-tech methodologies to design and test easy-to-implement seismic retrofitting techniques and maintenance programs.

Now available, two new project reports:

Testing of Materials and Building Components of Historic Adobe Buildings in Peru

This publication summarizes and describes the conclusions of more than 300 experimental tests carried out from 2011 to 2014 as part of Seismic Retrofitting Project and characterizes the material properties and structural behavior of the components of the four building prototypes selected for this project.
