NCID Postdoctoral Fellowship

The NCID Postdoctoral Fellowship is a one-year (12-month) fellowship that is geared towards early career scholars engaging in diversity scholarship.

Applications are welcome from diversity scholars in any field represented in the University of Michigan's schools and colleges.

This fellowship offers protected time for focused independent scholarship, as well as the opportunity to engage with the rich intellectual community at the University of Michigan. Fellows will also receive mentoring support from faculty in their academic departments.

Applicants' doctoral or comparable terminal degrees should be completed between July 1, 2016 and July 1, 2019.

NCID Scholars-in-Residence will have the opportunity to pursue their research and writing while actively engaging in our vibrant intellectual community that includes junior faculty and postdoctoral fellows, senior NCID faculty fellows, graduate students, as well as colleagues in affiliated academic units.

Scholars-in-Residence will need the support of a department chair at the University of Michigan, and will receive a stipend during their term of residence in Ann Arbor.
