


### Introduzione all'Architettura Moderna / Alberto Sartoris

Alberto Sartoris (1901-1998) was co-founder, with Rietveld and Le Corbusier, of the *Congrès Internationaux d'Architecture Moderne* (CIAM), and also friend of Fernando Távora who presented him to Siza, making some early exchanges between Portugal and Switzerland.
